In this hands-on workshop we look at how we've used storytelling and scenario-based learning approaches to demonstrate the complex processes of parliament. These approaches have enabled us to tackle challenging issues by presenting multiple perspectives and proposing flexible options for the classroom, such as a range of questions and activities, that provide opportunities for higher order and critical thinking. Informing this approach has been a strong consideration of teacher needs — building confidence in teaching civics and citizenship and teaching increasingly diverse cohorts of students in the diverse schools across Victoria. The Embracing Complexity session explores these approaches through practical examples and experiences of a number of the Parliament of Victoria's new classroom resources.








