1.30 pm Productive Partnerships

Narelle Wood, Senior Education Advisor, Parliament of Victoria

This workshop will look at how the Parliament of Victoria has developed partnerships with external organisations, including some seemingly unconventional organisations, to make connections between Parliament, civics education, broader curriculum areas and students' everyday lives.

These interdisciplinary approaches have provided opportunities for higher order and critical thinking, as well as problem-solving, while also providing opportunities to learn about parliamentary processes and the consequences of law-making. The Productive Partnerships session uses Mission Control - a partnership between the STEM Centre of Excellence and the Australian Space Agency - to explore the mutual benefit of the partnership model, the obstacles, lessons learned and future partnership possibilities.

2.00 pm Sorting the S.O.P

A practical demonstration of the Parliament of South Australia's newest resource - a deck of Separation of Powers cards that can be used for solo, 1-1, group and whole class activities, as well as formative assessment.

2.30 pm Enhancing Democracy by Broadening Pathways to Civics Education

Over the past year, the New Zealand Parliament's Education Team has embarked on a series of innovative initiatives designed to broaden access to and raise awareness of the inner workings of the New Zealand Parliament for new and diverse audiences.

Senior Education Adviser Troy Murphy will provide an overview of several of these initiatives undertaken by the education team, including:

- the development of the first educational resource with primary links to the English curriculum and reading and writing standards.
- the First Parliament Outreach Program conducted entirely in Te Reo Māori.
- the creation of Social Stories to familiarise neurodiverse learners with Parliament ahead of their visit.

8.50 am All Aboard the Magic Democracy Bus

In July 2022, the House of Assembly Education Office launched the Tasmanian Regional School Travel Rebate, offering a travel subsidy for schools 75km or more from Hobart to travel to Parliament House and take part in an HAEO program. Despite the fact that Tasmania is a small, deeply connected state, many schools struggle to make the journey to Hobart and participate in onsite parliamentary education. This is the story of the development and first year of the travel rebate, how it works in a Tasmanian context and what lessons were learnt along the way. Spoiler alert: some of these lessons sow the seeds for a sequel!

9.30 am Keynote Address: Mrs Darrilyn Dawson

Mrs Darrilyn Dawson will provide an interesting insight into life and civics education at Government House.

Coming from a long line of farming families in the South-West of Western Australia, Mrs Darrilyn Dawson is a passionate supporter of the diverse contributions the country sector makes to our state. Mrs Dawson holds a Bachelor of Education and a Diploma of Teaching.

Mrs Dawson has held a variety of roles in education throughout her 40-year career, including classroom teaching and as a Deputy Principal, and Principal in numerous primary schools.

10.45 am Art in Parliament

Dr Isla Macphail, Clerk Assistant (Committees) Secretary of the Parliament House Art Advisory Committee

The Parliament of Western Australia has an extensive art collection of contemporary and historical importance. Focused on Western Australian artists and incorporating significant public figures, Aboriginal story and culture, our evolving landscape, and endemic flora and fauna, the collection represents who we are as a state and how we have evolved over time. This engaging session presented by Dr Isla Macphail will be followed by a Parliament art tour.

1.15 pm Long Road to the Far North

The Queensland Legislative Assembly met in Cairns in May for a full parliamentary sitting week. This was the sixth regional sitting of Queensland Parliament, providing people in the regions the opportunity to witness democracy in action first-hand, and the opportunity for the Education team to take their show on the road.

Queensland's Parliamentary Education Team went along, with a bigger-than-Ben-Hur's-21st school activities program, regional classroom visits, a public service seminar and two Youth Parliaments. In this session, Rebecca and Maria will take you through the peaks and pitfalls of taking their show on the road.

1.45 pm Committee Challenge

This 30-minute practical session will enable parliamentary educators to reflect on their outreach and improve on skills required for better preparation through the case study of Fiji Parliament's outreach programs called 'Parliament Bus'.

Transport from the Airport

Perth's domestic airport is approximately 10 kms from the city, and is well serviced by taxis and rideshare services. A taxi to the CBD will cost approximately \$50 and outside of peak times will take around 20 minutes. The Airport Line train operates to and from the CBD. Trains run every 12 minutes in peak, every 15 minutes during the day and every 30 minutes at night. The cost is \$5 per ticket for the 18 minute journey.
